<b>Opportunities for revisiting previous learning</b>	<p>Analytical writing is layered from Year 7 beginning with basic paragraph structure and developing layers of evidence, analysis, subject terminology and inference as the units progress through Years 7, 8 and 9.</p> <p>Fiction and non-fiction writing is also taught throughout the 5 year syllabus with a layering of sentence types, vocabulary, punctuation, devices and structures and frames that are differentiated and built in across the units.</p>
