They also talked about the algorithms used by social media / you tube / tik tok etc which lead to a bias in content shown rather than a balanced viewpoint - not fake news per se, but that what you are seeing online reinforces one viewpoint only so it is important to look at reliable sources when forming an opinion.</p> <p>It would be great if these areas could also be covered at an age before it becomes an issue as well as maybe annual "watch out for this" type sessions on any disturbing trends highlighted by the 2 Johns or other similar organisations.</p>
